**Congregational Corner**

*It's that time again, when we honor those many people—not enough room for all the names—who make up the community of Boulder City United Methodist Church.*

This month's Congregational Corner honors MPs. No, not Members of Parliament, but rather the *Mystery Person*. You know, the person who is always the first at church each Sunday. The person who gets the key, turns on the lights, sets up chairs and puts out the hymnals and Bibles. The MP fills the candles, and readies the altar with cloths that have been washed and ironed. The Communion elements, purchased by MP, are readied on the altar. At the end of the service, the MP stacks the chairs and puts everything in its place.

MP places the printed bulletins on the table then hands them out to the people as they come in, making sure visitors are greeted and shown to a seat. MP picks up those who cannot drive and

brings them to worship. MP gets to church a little early, ready to bring God's light into the service and waits to take the light back out into the world.

MP holds the babies during the service so their parents can listen to the Word in peace. MP holds the hands of ailing men and women in their hospital room or at home, as they struggle with illness or sorrow. MP spends hours in prayer for others, and then takes time to write words—both of comfort and celebration—to other members of the church.

After worship, MP makes sure the Fellowship and monthly potlucks are ready, that there are plenty of supplies for everyone, takes out the trash and sweeps up when we are done.

Along with teaching all ages of Sunday school classes, MP opens worship, plays the piano, leads the congregation in song and reads the scriptures. MP sits on the floor and gives a lesson to

the children each Sunday, a lesson prepared with love and purpose.

MP sends out requests for tithes and contributions, and counts the offerings received. MP takes minutes of meetings and then types them so all are aware of what is happening in the life of the church. Parties, prayer groups and trainings are

Who is this *Mystery Person*? By now you know it's each of us, everyone who does a "job", who holds a hand and teaches and gives. Look around. If you are not one of the MPs, you are sure to be sitting by one or have received a note, a phone call, an email from one, or felt the hand of God through the prayers of many of the MPs. Being an MP is not an exclusive club, a position held by only a few in the church. There is always an opening for another MP, and you are invited to become one. Meanwhile, whether you are already an MP or not, take a minute to thank those you see who are in service to you and our church.

## Book Discussion Group

The Book Discussion Group is currently reading and discussing "The Kiss of God: 27 Lessons on the Holy Spirit" by James Howell. Chapters 21-27 will be discussed at the next meeting on Monday, April 29 at 6:30 p.m. Paula Richey will host the meeting at her home, 1502 Georgia.

"Making Toast" by Roger Rosenblatt will be the next book discussed. From the Book List: "When their daughter, Amy, died, Rosenblatt and his wife virtually moved in with their son-in-law and three grandchildren, all trying valiantly to cope with the death of a loving young woman and doctor felled by an asymptomatic heart condition. The Rosenblatts plunged themselves into the lives of Harris, six-year-old Jessica, four-year-old Sammy, and one-year-old James, shopping, cooking, shuttling, and tending to broken hearts, including their own. Essayist, author, and playwright Rosenblatt, as grandfather Boppo, is tender and amusing as he recalls simple moments in the life of his daughter. His wife, Ginny, a former schoolteacher, essentially leads Amy's life in her absence, congregating with the mothers at the children's school activities and outings. Blindsided by Amy's death, they are all fragile in their concerns for other family members; tardiness or a choking fit become occasions for worry. Friends who have lost children commiserate on the unbearable loss. Sensitive without being sentimental, Rosenblatt eases any potential discomfort on the reader's part at this invitation to view one family's efforts to cope with loss.

Sunday April 18 you want to be in church. Soon we will have the ditch on our property filled and level the church building site. The next phase is construction drawings. On the 18th we will talk about how we can, all of us, working together, as God has provided, begin the next phase of our vision: a United Methodist Church in Boulder City. Our message that day will be from the Old Testament book Nehemiah - stepping out in faith.

Nehemiah returned from captivity and walked around the walls of Jerusalem and found them in disrepair. "He told the people 'You see the trouble we are in, how Jerusalem lies

in ruins with its gates burned. Come, let us rebuild the wall of Jerusalem, so that we may no longer suffer disgrace.' I told them that the hand of my God had been gracious upon me, and also the words that the king had spoken to me. Then they said, "Let us start building!" So they committed themselves to the common good. But when Sanballat the Horonite and Tobiah the Ammonite official, and Geshem the Arab heard of it, they mocked and ridiculed us, saying, "What is this that you are doing? Are you rebelling against the king?" Then I replied to them, "The God of heaven is the one who will give us success, and we his servants are going to start building; but you have no share or claim or historic right in Jerusalem." (Nehemiah 2:17-20)

The Care Group Ministry, meeting once a month, is led by Pastor John. Each Care Minister makes sure every person in our congregation is covered with prayer, and directs any special needs of those in our congregation towards a solution.

Church Women United, a social and service group within the church, is chaired by Kitty Ritenour and meets once a month. All women of our congregation are invited to share an evening of fellowship, fun and sometimes a specific work of the church.

The Altar Guild falls under the Worship Committee, led by Devin Streater. Devin oversees the entire organization of our worship service, a hundred-plus details. He sees things to make our service go smoothly that none of the rest of us would see and we are so very fortunate that he makes himself available to us every single Sunday. He is another one who arrives early and stays late every week. But back to Altar Guild: Linda Robertshaw, Becky Walters and Carla Quinn help me throughout the year with altar duties, which means setting up before the service, taking down after, and washing and ironing the linens during the week. Another area of the Altar Guild is making sure we have fresh flowers each week. You can help with the flowers (and not even be on the committee!). Without any one of the people on these committees, our church would suffer. I want to thank all of them for the many, many hours of service they give so willingly.
